RE: Halloween - Trick - or - Treating

Dear Children and Parents/Guardians,

For this year's Halloween, the Village is recommending that "Trick-or-Treating" be allowed in Bloomingdale on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>October 31st</u>, <u>2019</u>, <u>between the hours of 3 pm and 7 pm</u>. The following suggestions from the Bloomingdale Police Department and the National Child Safety Council might also ensure that this is a fun and safe day for our children:

1. Trick-or-Treating

- A responsible adult or teen should accompany each group.
- Walk! Do <u>not</u> run while going trick-or-treating.
 Never enter a stranger's house even if invited.
- If unaccompanied, Parents should know exactly what route their children are taking.
- Carry "trick-or-treating" bags that have handles, to keep your arms free.

2. Treats

- Never eat anything until at home <u>after</u> the treats have been examined by your parents.
- Check the wrapper of commercial treats for signs of tampering.
 Throw away anything unwrapped.
 Cut and wash fruit before eating.
- Notify the police if harmful items are found.

3. Parents and Guardians

- Know which friends your children will be with.
- Do <u>not</u> leave your home unattended on Halloween night, if possible.
- Leave your porch or driveway light on, so children will know it's okay to visit your home.
- Keep your pets <u>inside</u> your house on Halloween night.

The Bloomingdale Police Department will have extra police officers in both marked and unmarked cars patrolling the Village to ensure that your children are safe and vandalism is minimized. Please report <u>any</u> suspicious persons or acts of vandalism to the Bloomingdale Police Department immediately.
