Trustee Brown Remembered

Floyd Brown, trustee for the Village of Glendale Heights, died en route to Central DuPage Hospital on Tuesday, April 2, 1974. Floyd, his wife Betty, and son Michael moved to the village more than 12 years ago. He immediately became active in village affairs, aside from being a go-getter for the local ball teams; Floyd was a charter member of the Glendale Heights Jaycees and an active member of the Village Plan Commission. On April 15, 1969, Floyd was elected village trustee. He served on many committees; public works, sewer and water and has been chairman of the building committee throughout this time. His activities have been many and covered all phases of municipal interest. In his work as building committee chairman, he was instrumental in upgrading both the building code and the zoning ordinances. In his activities on the industrial committee he worked tirelessly to entice commercial and industrial firms to build in Glendale Heights. In relation to this he was aggressive in enlarging the sewer and water mains within the village so these facilities would be available for commercial and industrial growth. He was a leader in having a storm drainage study made to minimize flooding; in stressing the need for a comprehensive plan for the village including the North Avenue Corridor study, so that Glendale Heights might have a controlled, orderly growth. His tireless effort to promote his village will long be remembered and the final results of his work is yet to be realized.
