Edward Lichthardt, 68, of 104 W. Elm Street, Roselle, died yesterday following a heart attack suffered while he was at work at the Set Screw Mfg. Co., Bartlett. He had just begun his usual duties on the afternoon shift when he suffered the attack. A doctor was summoned and pronounced him dead. He had been under a doctor's care for some time for a mild heart condition, but it was not considered serious. Lichthardt was born Jan. 30, 1888 in Schaumburg Township, the son of Henry and Caroline Wilkening Lichthardt. He lived in Schaumburg Township and farmed until two years ago when he retired and moved to Roselle. On May 1, 1909, he married Eleanor Hitzeman in Roselle. She survives along with two sons, Elmer of Eagle, Wis., and Clarence of St. Charles Township; a sister, Mrs. Herman Hitzeman, Elgin, and four grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, a sister, and four brothers. The Rev. W. H.
