Herman Rohlwing, 63, of Roselle route 1, died of a heart attack Sunday noon at the farm of his son, Edmond, on Meacham Road, near Schaumburg. He had been helping out on the farm for a few days due to the fact Edmond, his wife and their children were visiting friends in St. Charles, Mo. Born July 11, 1890 in Elk Grove Township, and moving to Roselle in February 1951, he had been engaged in farming in Elk Grove Township for 37 years. For the last three years he had been doing carpenter work for the Midwest Folding Products Co. at Roselle. On May 5, 1913 he was united in marriage with Emma Panzer, daughter of Ferdinand and Sophia Fasse Panzer. Prospect. He was a member of St. Peters Lutheran Church, and for the past four years served as cemetery trustee.
