Henry Schrage

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at Palatine Lutheran church, of which he was a staunch member, for Mr. Henry Schrage, who died Dec. 13 after a long illness. He had been confined to his bed since October 15. Mr. Schrage, the son of the late Henry Schrage, Sr., and Caroline Schrage, nee Harmening, was born in Schaumburg June 24, 1864 and was christened shortly after his birth by Rev. Schmidt, pastor of St. Peter Lutheran church, Schaumburg. He was confirmed by the same pastor in 1878. He made his home in Schaumburg Township on Higgins Rd. until 1907 when he moved to Palatine, which has since been his home. Deceased was active in former years in the affairs of the Palatine Lutheran Church and was a member of the church building committee for the present building. There remain two brothers and five sisters. One brother, Fred Schrage, of Schaumburg, who is 92 years of age, was unable to attend the funeral services. The other brother is William Schrage, with whom the deceased made his home. The sisters are Mrs. Sophie Falke, Mrs. Mary Hibbing, Mrs. Anna Schmaedeke, Mrs. Louise Hibbing, all of whom reside in the vicinity of Crete and Mrs. August Mueller, of Palatine.
