Schaumburg man takes own life

Frank Sporleder, 72, Schaumburg, took his own life Tuesday afternoon. The last time he was seen alive was about 3 o'clock. A son found him dead in his car in the garage at six o'clock. A hose led from the exhaust pipe into the interior of the car. A coroner's jury gave a verdict of suicide while temporarily insane due to despondency over ill health. Mr. Sporleder had been a resident of Schaumburg many years. He leaves his wife and seven children, Herman of St. Charles, Walter of Round Lake, Charlotte of Santa Anna, Calif., George of Elmhurst, Margaret, Herbert, and Alice who live at home. Remains will lay in state at the Karstens funeral home Friday evening with funeral there Saturday afternoon at 3:00 o'clock. Interment will be in Lake Street Memorial Park, Elgin.
