Library Presentations

BPL Grade-Level Presentations

Kindergarten

The Author Celebration Program is offered by the Youth Services Staff each year from January through March. The presentation features the life and work of Eric Carle with a video, dancing, crafts, and books he authored. This program is available either at the library or in the classroom.

1st Grade

The Celebrate Reading Party is presented at BPL. Students enjoy a party with a craft, stories, treats, and a behind-the-scenes tour to celebrate the reading skills developed while in 1st grade. Special party invitations will be sent to all 1st grade classes in the spring of each school year.

2nd Grade

Youth Services Staff give an exciting introduction to some of our most popular series fiction for students who are stretching their reading skills, as well as an explanation of how to find transitional chapter books in the library.

3rd – 5th Grades

Programs including Genre Studies, Dewey Decimal System, and Electronic Databases are available to students who are beginning to do more library research.

Illinois Book Award Book Talks for Grades K-8

A Youth Services staff member will do book talks of the newest Rebecca Caudill (grades 4-8), Bluestem (grades 3-5), and Monarch (grades K-2) Illinois Book Award lists.

STEM Presentation (Grades K-5)

To promote STEM to your students, Youth Services staff members will do 30-minute presentations on a variety of topics using the library's science kits. The library will tailor the presentation to your curriculum. Each presentation will include a chance for the students to have hands on time with the science kits and ideas for experiments to try at home.

Special Collections

Storypacks

These backpacks are designed to provide fingertip access to theme programs with books, puzzles, puppets, music, and DVDs. Themes include: alphabet, colors, shapes, birds, dinosaurs, fairy tales, school, and more. For pre-K to 2nd grade.

Donna Beth Froio Foreign Language and Cultural Collection

The Froio Collection is a multicultural resource collection that includes books, DVDs, CDs, and kits on the study of foreign languages, cultures, folklore, ethnic recipes, music, poetry, literature, and history in a variety of languages. Current languages include Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Indian languages, Italian, Polish, Russian, Spanish, and many more. For preschool to 6th grade.



Parent/Teacher Collection

Books and kits that provide parents and teachers with information on child development, classroom support materials, and parenting issues.

Textbooks

Bloomington Public Library has non-circulating copies of textbooks from Bloomington School District 13, Consolidated School District 93, and Lake Park High School.

Science and Music Kits

These high quality kits may be checked out for use in your STEM and music classes. Science Kits contain scientific materials and objects such as microscopes, seismographs, magnets and more. Our Music Kits include hand bells, wooden harps, percussion instruments and even a keyboard. Most Science and Music Kits come with instructions and activities and are supported by other non-fiction materials and DVDs in our collections.

eBooks, Audiobook, and Streaming

The library offers multiple options for downloadable media, eBooks, and audiobooks through Digital Library of Illinois, eRead Illinois, Kanopy, Flipster, and Hoopla. To download an item, you must have a Bloomington Public Library card and compatible laptop, tablet, or smartphone. These services are accessible from anywhere.
